Took lead in design and implementation of two key KWCA's projects; southern Kenya landscape project aimed to catalyse landscape learning and coordination for the KWCA's regional associations and other partners working in the southern part of Kenya and in the mainstreaming of youth of engagement in conservancy leadership and management

The problems/challenges KWCA aims to tackle

- Uncoordinated conservation efforts in Southern Kenya
- Less agency & optimism among young people in conservancies
- Exclusion of youth in conservancy leadership

- Supporting community led conservation initiatives to keep land open, healthy and communally managed for the benefit of pastoralism and conservation.
- Define the landscape of southern Kenya and create a common shared vision for the contribution of conservancies

Samwella's achievements...

- Structured an engagement framework for the southern Kenya landscape project, setting a defined role, mission, vision and a map of the landscape ensuring continuity
- Took part in developing southern Kenya landscape map showing the geographical extent and the spatial connection between the 5 sub-landscapes (Maasai Mara, South Rift, Amboseli, Athi-Kaputei and Tsavo).
- Organized the first ever national conservancy youth forum that brought together young people from 11 landscapes across the country
- Organized two peer learning visits to Tsavo and Mara for conservancy members and a partners' visit on community conservation policy and practice in Kenya
- Facilitated and attended IUCN's first ever Africa Protected Areas Congress (APAC) in Kigali Rwanda
- Supported in the revision of KWCA policies and guidelines towards being gender responsive

- Fundraising: Supported fundraising through proposal development e.g Maliasili award (USD 3million), USAID, WWF – IKI Small Grants(ANBT)
- Strategy Development: Took lead in the development of KWCA's youth engagement strategy
- Institutional Strengthening: 3 key landscape associations;
 Baringo (BCCA), Tsavo (TTWCA) and Amboseli (AET)
- Grants Reporting: Donor reports timely delivery and quality improved
