#### **Summary**

#### The problem Harambee aims to tackle

- Over 60% of South African youth, aged 15-34, are unemployed.
- Economic growth is not creating enough job opportunities in the formal sector to absorb new entrants into the labor market.

### The solution Harambee provides...

Harambee's zero rated platform – Sayouth.mobi – gives young people a full view of opportunities spanning the formal economy, and informal economy (consisting of microenterprises and public employment programs). This forms part of our Systems Change agenda to fix the broken systems surrounding young people.

#### Nhlanhla's achievements...

- Co-developed and maintained the organization's Systems Change dashboard, which we continue to rely on, and will continue to do so until June 2025 (the end of the 5-year Systems Change grant period)
- Managed the Microenterprise division's first research partnership, with an external service provider, to get a better understanding of the microenterprise landscape in South Africa, as well as understand the support young people need to find successes in their own businesses. Findings from the report were used to formulate our microenterprise strategy.
- Assisted to launch a pilot programme in the Agriculture sector that seeks to support 200 young people to earn sustainable incomes from market gardening activities.
- Was invited to participate in an television interview with CGTN to discuss and showcase our work and research in the microenterprise space.
